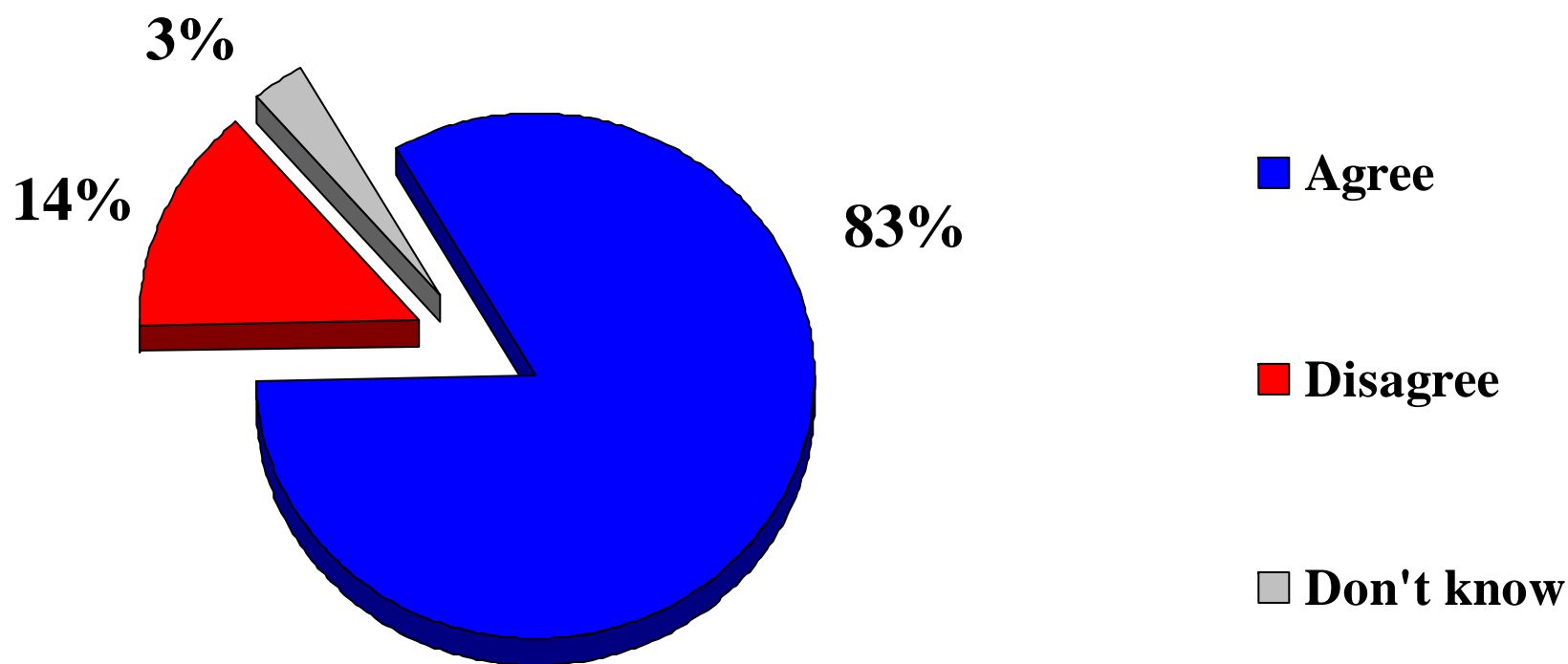


Americans Want “Health” Care Not *Sick* Care

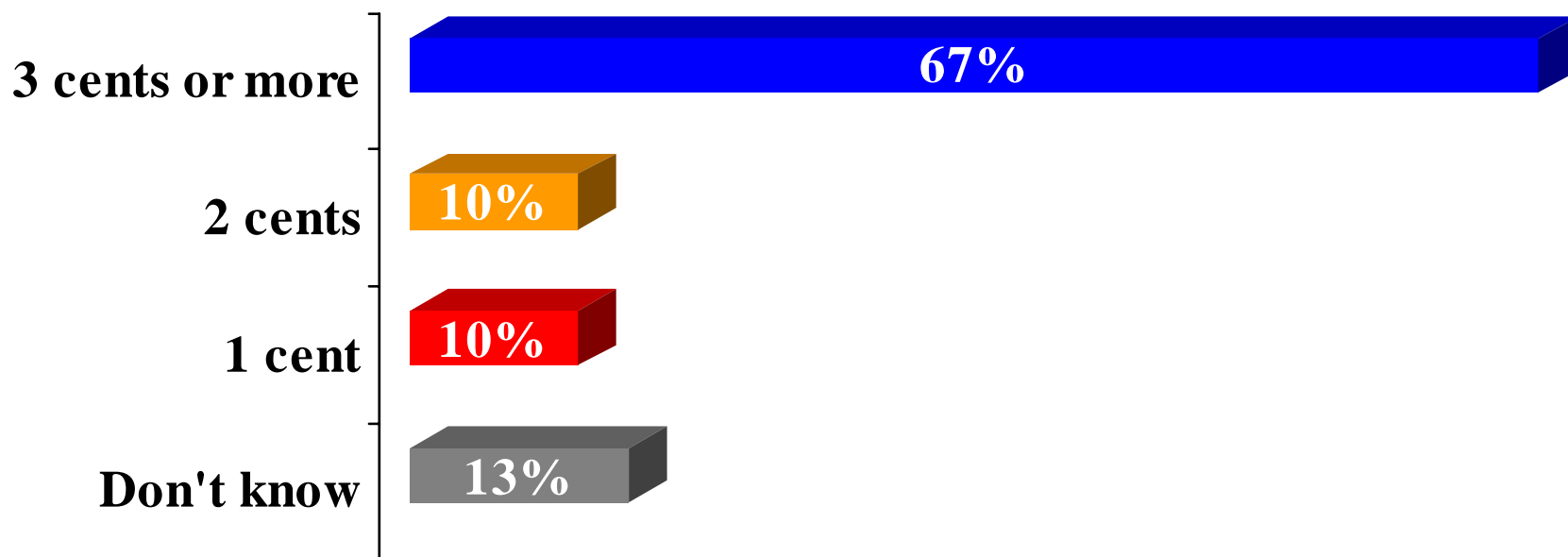
Do you agree or disagree that our health care system should be redesigned to encourage preventing illness rather than dealing with disease only once symptoms are apparent?

Americans Want More Spent on Public Health Research

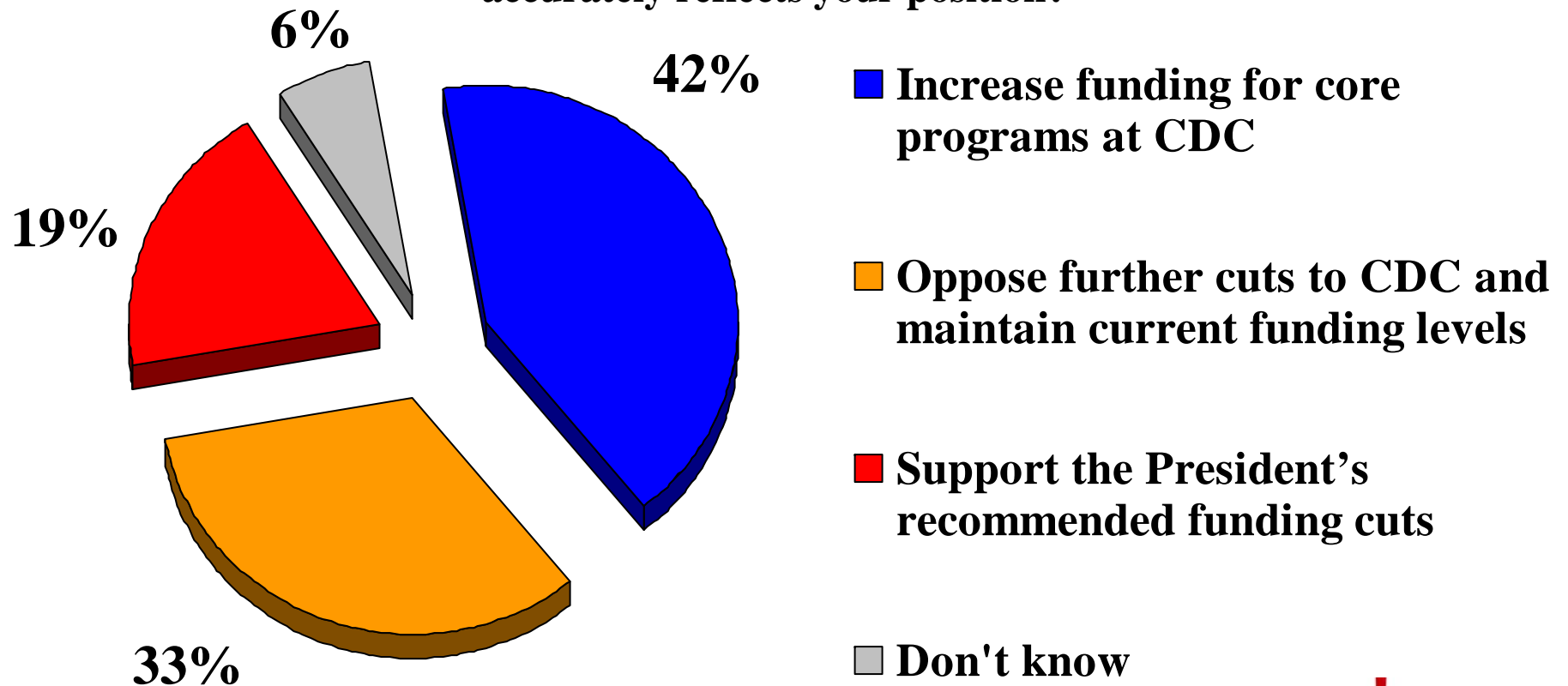
Currently, the U.S. spends about one cent of every health care dollar on prevention and public health research. How many cents of each health dollar do you think we **SHOULD** spend?

Funding for CDC

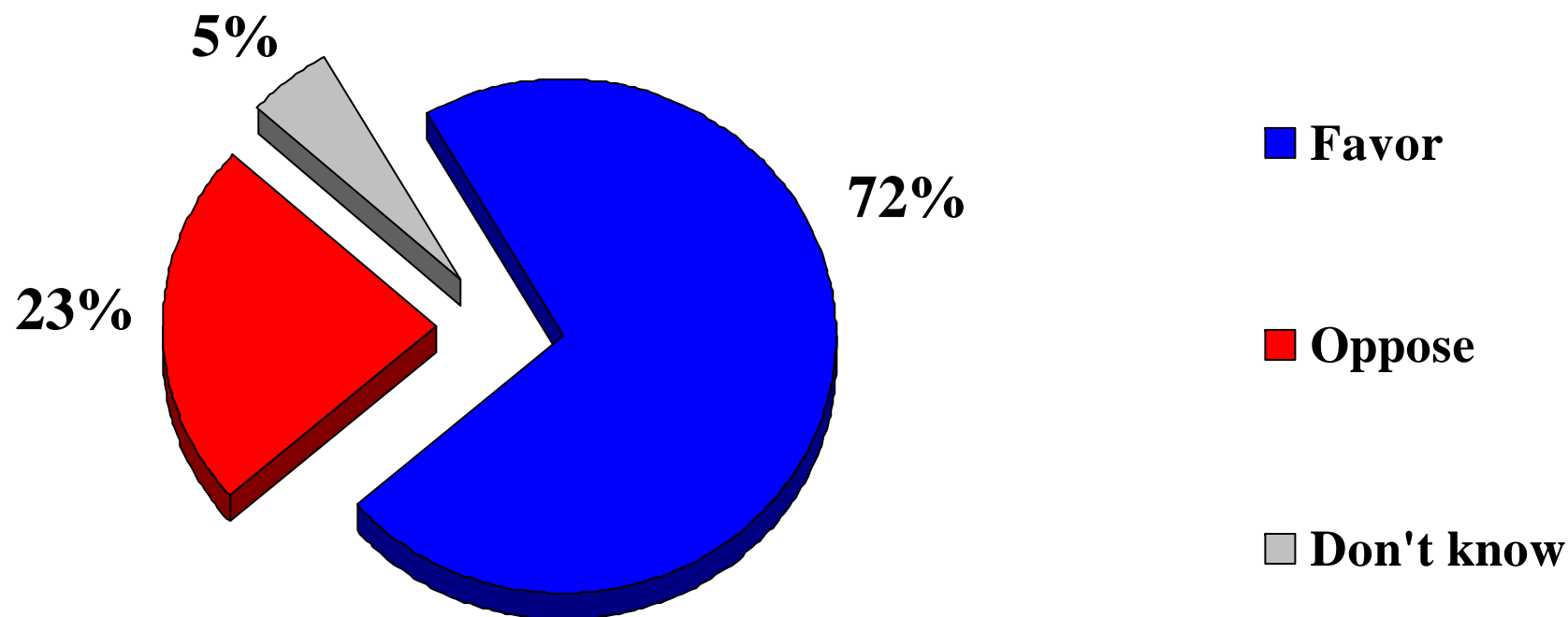

State and Local Health Department Funding

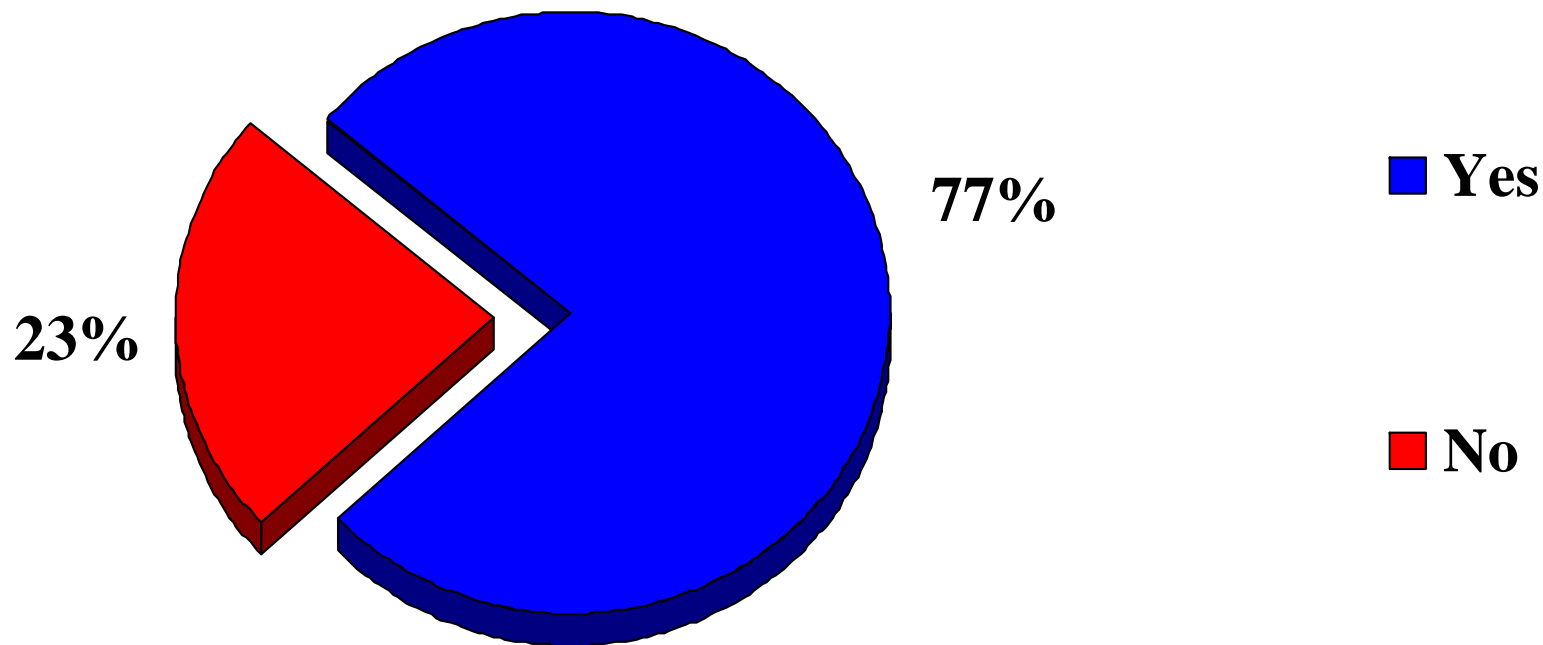
Do you favor or oppose increasing federal funding for state and local health departments across the country that are expected to prepare for and respond to threats to our health?

Doctors are Talking to Patients About Prevention

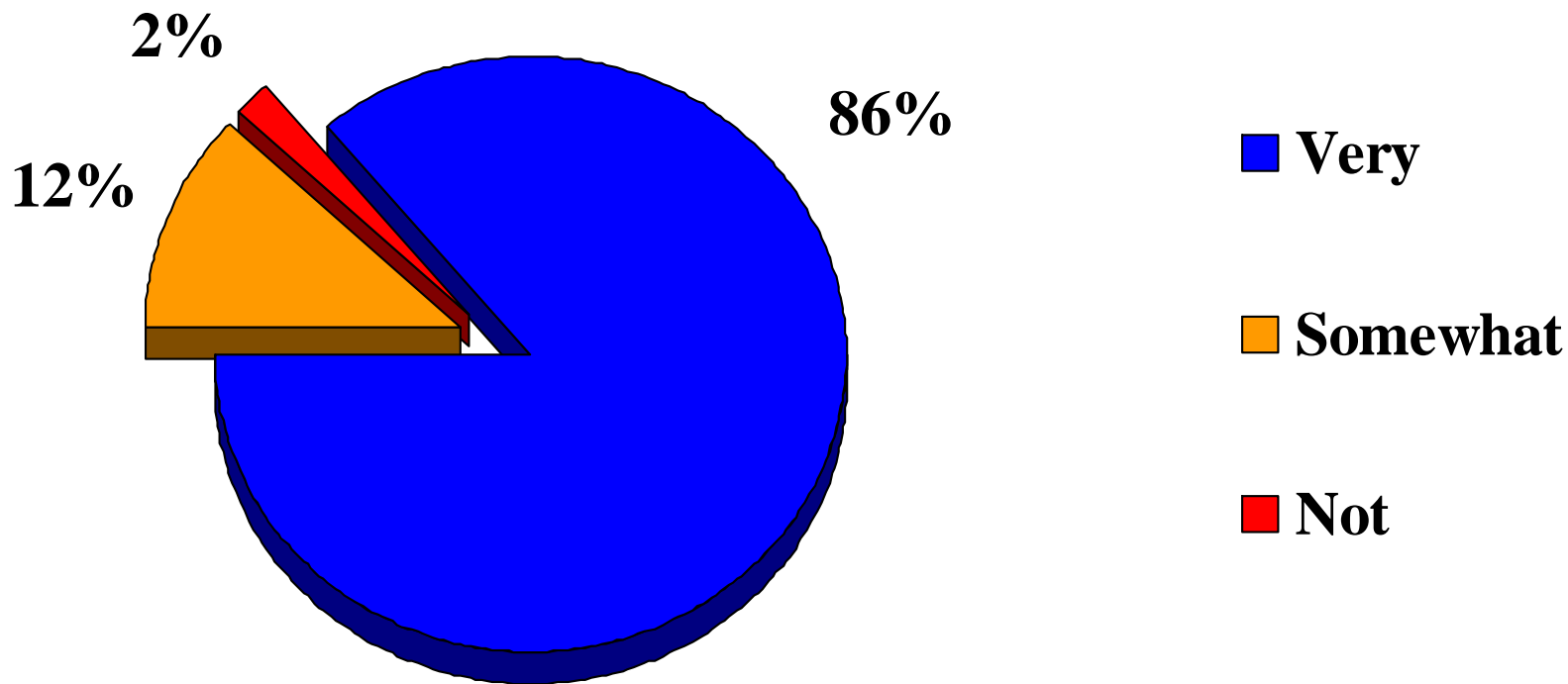
Has your doctor ever talked to you about what you can do to prevent health problems?

Very Important to Prevent Own Health Problems

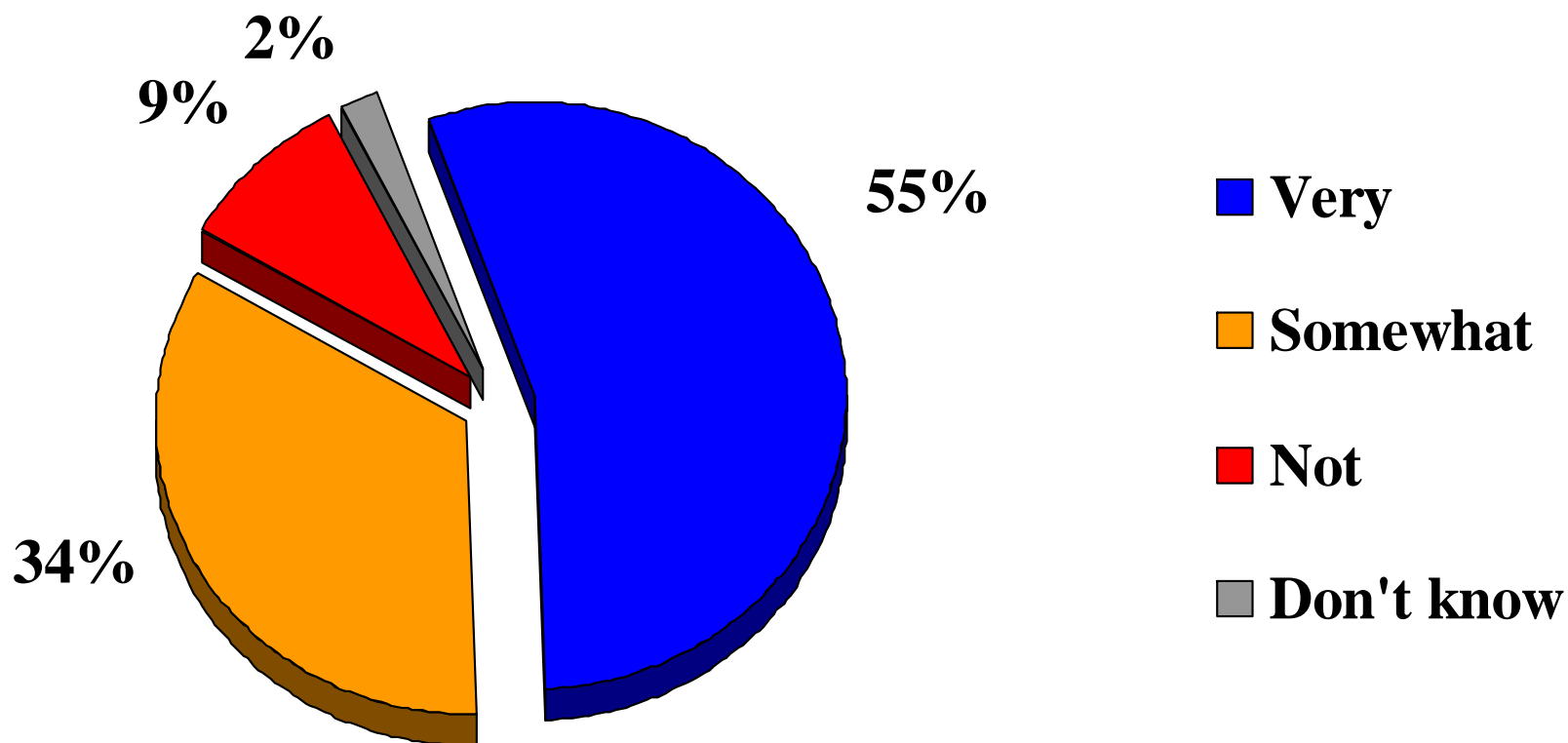
How important do you think it is for people to do more to prevent their own health problems?

Very Valuable to Invest in Research

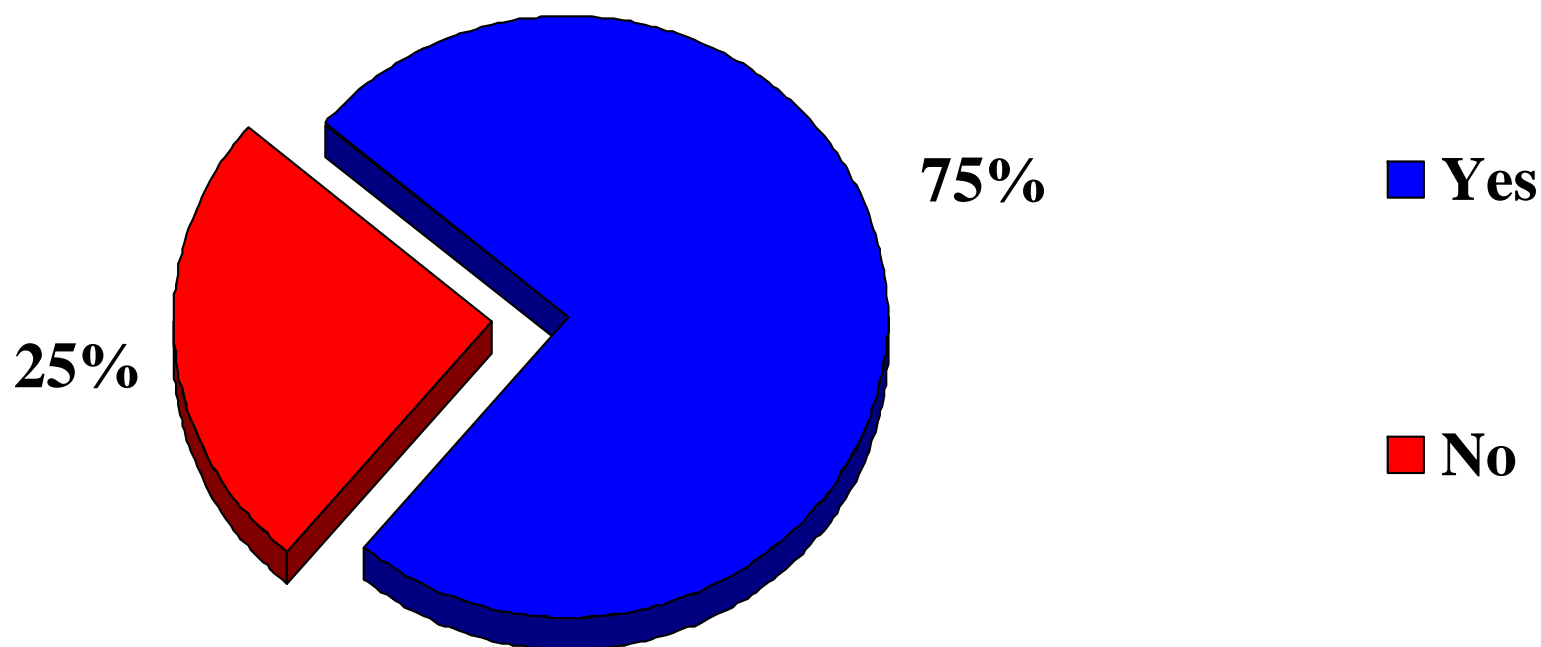
How valuable is it for the U.S. to invest in medical and health research that allows us to predict a person's chance of developing a disease?
