Survey Methodology

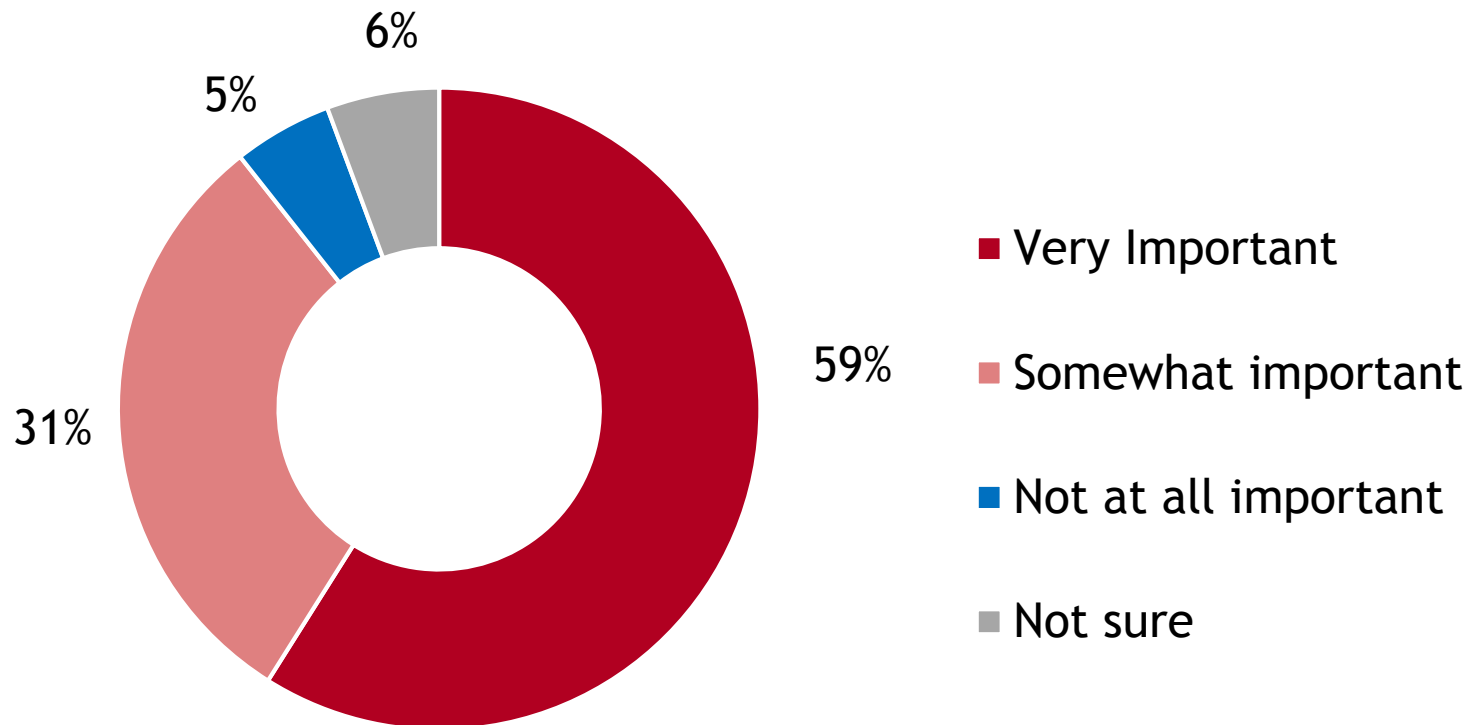
This online survey was conducted by Zogby Analytics on behalf of Research!America in March 2020, among 1,013 adults 18-29 years old. The survey has a theoretical sampling error of +/- 3.1 percentage points.*

Comparisons are made to an online survey conducted by Zogby Analytics on behalf of Research!America in January 2020, among 208 adults 18-29 years old, and an an online survey conducted by Zogby Analytics on behalf of Research!America in January 2019, among 209 adults 18-29 years old.

In thinking about threats to your health, how important is it that elected officials at all levels listen to advice from scientists?

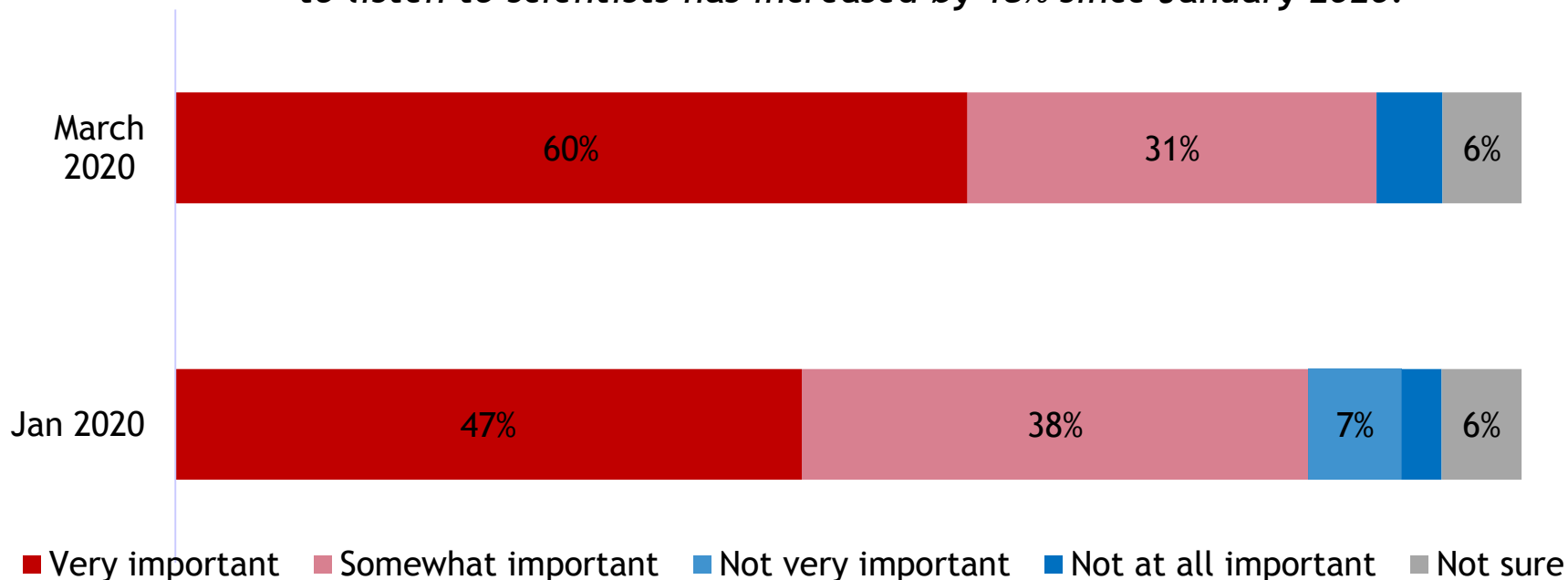


Increase in Those Saying Elected Officials Should Listen to Scientists

In thinking about threats to your health, how important is it that elected officials at all levels listen to advice from scientists?

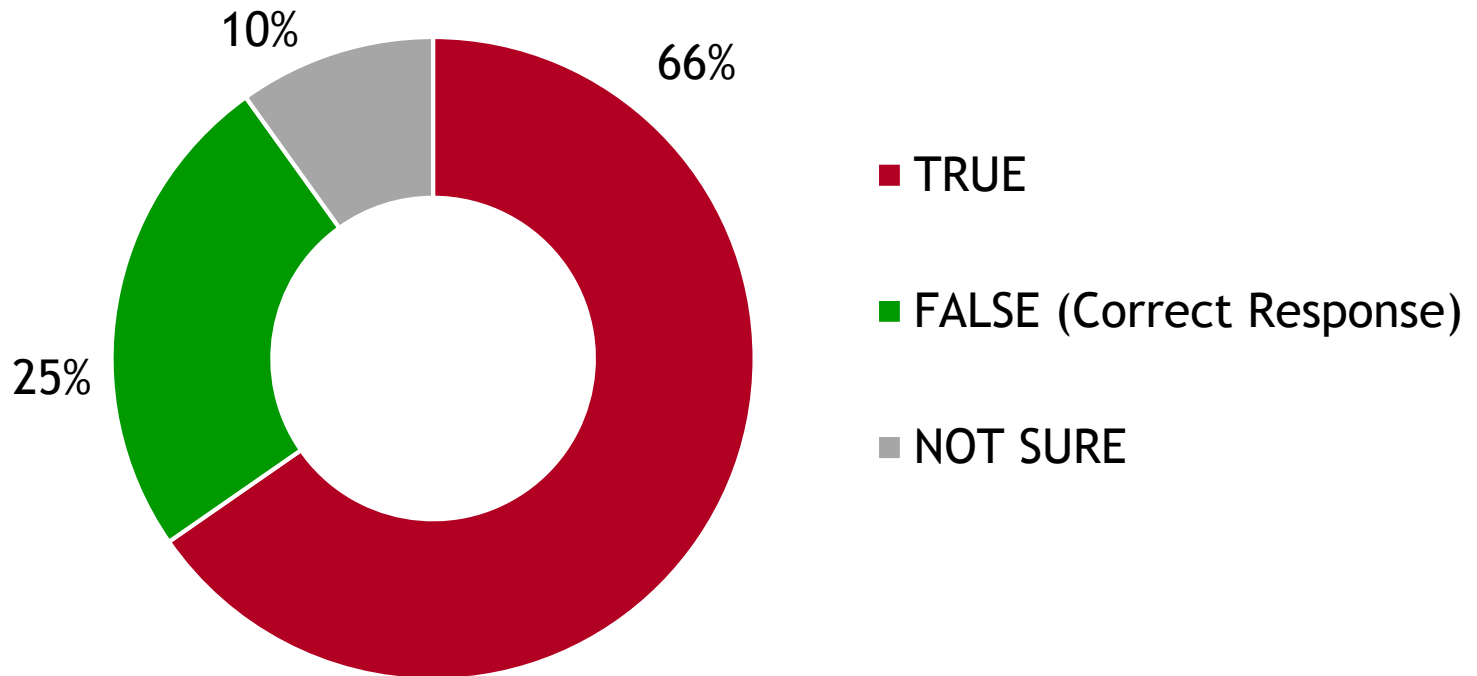


18 to 29 year olds saying it is "very important" for elected officials to listen to scientists has increased by 13% since January 2020.
