



Ohio As a Leader


Please indicate whether or not you believe Ohio is a leader in ...

In your opinion, what is the most important health issue facing people in Ohio today?




Accelerating Investment in Research is a High Priority

Most Residents Know Where Research is Conducted in Ohio




Teaching & Research Hospitals More Likely to be Good Hospitals

Competition or Cooperation in Medical Research?




Ohioans Support Incentives for Companies to Invest in State

Most Think Health Research Important to Ohio's Economy


How important do you think medical and health research is to the economy of Ohio?






Scientific Research Important to Ohio's Economy

Congress Should Support Policies that Encourage Research


Do you agree or disagree that Congress should support tax and regulatory policies that encourage private industries to conduct more medical research?





Many Ohioans Say U.S. Not Spending Enough on Research



Majority Willing to Pay More to Invest in Health Research


Would you support or oppose paying an additional \$1 per week in taxes if you knew for sure that it would go towards the U.S. investing more in research to improve health?





Few Ohioans Want Research Cut in 2012 Federal Budget


As Congress and the administration consider the federal budget for 2012, should funding for medical research be increased, decreased, eliminated or frozen at current levels?





Many Ohioans Agree Basic Research is Necessary


Do you agree or disagree that basic research which advances the frontiers of knowledge is necessary and should be supported by the federal government, even if it brings no immediate benefits?





Scientists Should Have Most Influence Over Research Funding


Which one of the following do you feel should have the most influence on how government medical research funds are spent?





Very Important for Elected Officials to Listen to Scientists


When thinking about threats to our health, how important is it that elected officials at all levels listen to the advice from scientists and public health professionals when setting policy or spending priorities?





Very Important to Encourage Youths' Pursuit of Science Careers


How important is it for Ohio to encourage young people to pursue careers that require a solid education in science?





Very Important to Create Science Career Opportunities in Ohio


How important is it for Ohio to create more opportunities for careers in science and research for its young people?




How useful would it be if your health care records were also available electronically?






Most Believe Research for Health Equity is Important

Important for Ohio to Support Education of Health Professionals


How important is it for Ohio to support the education of health professionals for rural and urban underserved communities?
