
What would you say is the single most important health issue facing the nation?


Do you agree or disagree with the following statement? "The U.S. is losing its global competitive edge in science, technology and innovation."





Majority of Americans Say U.S. Doesn't Have Best Health Care


Do you believe the United States has the best health care system in the world?





Opinions Split on Whether Care is Based on Most Recent Research


Do you believe the health care services you personally receive are based on the best and most recent research available?



How important is it that our nation support research that focuses on how well the health care system is functioning?




When it comes to rising health care costs, would you say research to improve health is part of the problem or part of the solution?





Very Important to Eliminate Health Disparities



Bigger Slice of Health Dollar Should Go Toward Research



Half of Americans Willing to Pay Tax for Research


Would you be willing to pay \$1 per week more in taxes if you were certain that all of the money would be spent for additional medical research?





Medical Research is Not Making Enough Progress, Americans Say


Do you believe that we are making enough progress in medical research in the U.S.?





Most Americans Say Use of Animals is Necessary


Do you believe the use of animals in medical research is necessary for progress in human health?





Americans Support Increased Federal Funding for ESCR


Do you favor or oppose expanding federal funding for research using embryonic stem cells?






Investing in Health Research Important to Job Creation, Recovery

Research is Important to State's Economies


How important do you think research and innovation is to your state's economy?





Government Should Emphasize STEM Careers for Young Americans


Do you believe the federal government should place more emphasis on increasing the number of young Americans who pursue careers in science, technology, engineering and mathematics?





Most Agree that Basic Research is Necessary






How important would you say it is that the U.S. work to improve health globally through research and innovation?









Opinions Mixed on Amount of Time for FDA Approval



Most Don't Know Their Elected Officials' Positions on Research


How well informed would you say you are about the positions of your senators and representative when it comes to their support of medical, health and scientific research?






Important for Elected Officials to Listen to Health Professionals

In thinking about threats to your health, how important is it that elected officials at all levels listen to advice from scientists and public health professionals?









Most Americans Don't Know Where Research is Conducted

Can you name any institution, company or organization where medical and health research is conducted?




Opinions Divided on Increasing Investment vs. Sufficient Funding


Wide Benefits of Research are Convincing Argument for Americans

Rare Disease Research is Convincing for Americans


Do you find the following statement convincing? "Without federal funding to find a cure, there is no hope for people with rare diseases because private industry can't justify the expense."





Americans Concerned About Research Moving Abroad


Do you find the following statement convincing? "Unless the federal government funds more research, a lot of medical research will move abroad to countries like China."





Lowering the Cost of Health Care A Strong Argument for Research


Do you find the following statement convincing? "Increased funding for medical and health research can lower the cost of health care by finding new ways to prevent or cure disease."
