Criteria for Evaluation

We are dedicated to supporting projects that enable early-career scientists to increase their level of engagement with public officials (elected/nonelected) and community leaders and members. The project can encompass a single event or a series of activities or workshops.

The most competitive proposals will facilitate collaborations across STEM disciplines. Collaborations including the following STEM disciplines are encouraged (and are not limited to): psychology, sociology, anthropology, physical sciences, biological sciences, biomedical sciences, computer science and related technologies, engineering, economics, math, and medicine.

Highly competitive proposals will address the following:

- 1. Goal(s): The goal(s) of the proposal attempt to address the problem(s) explained in the application and are clearly explained.
- 2. Potential Impact: The proposal describes how the activity will create dialogue with the target audience and how the project organizers will develop new skills.
- 3. Activities: Proposed activities are clearly stated, non-partisan in nature, and clearly show engagement with public officials (elected/non-elected) and community members.
- 4. Budget: A line-item budget is laid out clearly and expenses are justified. A fiscal sponsor with direct contact information (phone number and email address) is included.
