Survey Methodology

This online survey was conducted by Zogby Analytics on behalf of Research!America in early January 2026, among 1,007 adults plus additional adults for minority oversampling. The survey has a theoretical sampling error of +/- 3.1 percentage points. The sample is weighted to best represent the demographics of the population being surveyed. Weighted variables may include age, race, gender, and political party.

Due to rounding, the percent totals may not add up to 100 on some slides.



Nearly 7 in 10 Say Congress Should Invest More Taxpayer Dollars To Advance S&T


Do you believe Congress should invest more taxpayer dollars to advance science and technology in the U.S.?

 54% say “yes”



This year marks the United States' 250th birthday. In thinking about our nation's priorities over the next 50 years, how important do you think the following should be?









7 in 10 Would Be More Likely to Support a Candidate Who Favors Increased Medical and Health Research Spending


If you knew a candidate for Congress favored spending more on medical and health research, would you be more or less likely to support that person for election?




Confidence In Nurses, Doctors, and Scientists Is High

 78% say “all” or “most”



Combined “all” or “most” number is highest in 5 years (since January 2021).








Only Half of Americans Are Aware S&T Research Is Conducted in Every State





Please indicate which of the following statements comes closer to your view.


Statement A: Artificial intelligence has tremendous potential to bring about advancements that will improve my life.




